Nothing About Your Bloom Box Has to Go to Waste

A few easy ways to enjoy every part for longer.

Your wax blooms, sola wood flowers, greenery and keepsake cylinder can all keep going after the first arrangement. Here is what works, what to avoid and what to do when a bloom has given you all its scent.

WARM EVERY BLOOM WELL

Start with one bloom

Place one wax bloom in the clean warmer dish, then turn on the warmer. There is no need to crowd the dish.

Keep the heat gentle

Use the Zen Bloom electric warmer on a level, heat-safe surface. Turn it off when the room smells just right and let the wax cool before touching the dish.

Give the scent room

Choose a spot where air moves naturally through the room, away from an open window or strong draft that carries the fragrance straight outside.

Change blooms when you feel like it

Let the wax cool completely, remove it from the dish and switch scents. You can warm the same bloom again until the fragrance has faded.

Know when it is finished

When the wax warms but you can no longer smell it, that bloom is ready for its next use.

Never add water or fragrance oil to hot wax, and never move the warmer while the wax is liquid.

Give the Pieces a Second Life

The fragrance may fade. The rest can still be useful.

A finished bloom does not have to go straight into the bin. Keep the ideas that suit your home and skip the rest. Always let wax cool fully before handling it.

SPENT WAX

Make a fire starter

For an outdoor firepit or a wood-burning fireplace, add cooled wax shavings to a cardboard egg cup filled with dry wood shavings. Use only where fire starters are allowed, and keep flames supervised.

Clean the warmer dish

Follow the instructions that came with your warmer. Once the wax is cool, remove it gently and wipe the dish clean before choosing your next scent.

Dispose of it properly

If you are finished with the wax, let it cool and place it in your household waste. Do not pour wax into a sink or drain.

SOLA WOOD FLOWERS

Keep them dry

Sola wood is porous, so dust the flowers rather than washing them. Water can warp the petals or change their colour.

Dust gently

Use a soft makeup brush, or a hair dryer on the cool, low setting held well back from the petals.

Refresh the fragrance

Add one drop of your favourite fragrance oil at the base of a sola flower, away from painted surfaces and delicate furniture.

Give them a new job

Move the flowers into a bud vase, add them to a wreath or use one as a pretty gift topper.

Small reminder: wax can soften in heat, and fragrance oil can mark fabric or furniture. Protect the surface underneath.

Keep the Rest in the Rotation

Your greenery and cylinder are ready for whatever comes next.

The permanent pieces are the easiest part to keep using. A quick clean and a fresh spot in the house are usually all they need.

PERMANENT GREENERY

Wipe, do not soak

Run a barely damp cloth along the leaves to lift dust, then let them air-dry before arranging.

Fluff after shipping

If a leafy stem was pressed in the box, gently open the greenery with your fingers. No tugging or sharp bends needed.

Use it somewhere new

Add the greenery to a vase, wreath, garland or gift wrap when you are ready to change the arrangement.

THE KEEPSAKE CYLINDER

Refill it

Use the cylinder again when your next bouquet arrives, or fill it with older sola flowers and greenery from more than one box.

Put it to work

Between bouquets, it makes a useful holder for brushes, pens, knitting needles or a rolled-up gift.

Mix old with new

Move last season's blooms to a bedroom, bathroom or desk, then combine favourite pieces from different boxes whenever you want a change.

Reuse what works for you, pass along what somebody else will enjoy, and keep your favourites in view.
